



First Nations and Métis Health and Wellness Research Network (FMHRN: Saskatchewan NEIHR) is a [CIHR NEIHR](#) funded consortium of Metis, First Nations, and allied individuals, organizations, communities, and institutions with long-established leadership and working relationships in Indigenous health research, training and knowledge mobilization. This Network has grown out of the opinions, ideas and leadership of Saskatchewan's First Nations and Métis governments, communities, and other key stakeholders.

It will facilitate a focused, community-driven approach, so health research dollars flow more effectively into communities, with the Saskatchewan Network operating as a matchmaker between communities, researchers, and funding opportunities. At the core of this Network is the foundational belief that it belongs to the First Nations and Métis peoples of Saskatchewan, and can grow and evolve based on what they identify as community needs and priorities.
